WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

Well, Fall is upon us already. Where has the time gone?

Fall is traditionally a time to harvest, since many major grains and fruits do still come ripe for harvest in the days just passed or coming, and we will still celebrate these gifts of God in nature in this season.

I know that in these days with modern agricultural methods harvests come all year round. And with modern transport, we get the 'Autumn' harvests of Southern Hemisphere fields in the Spring, and they get our year end harvests in their Springs. Fewer and fewer of us work as farmers, too, so the whole traditional sense of a harvest time of year seems to be less and less viscerally understood or experienced anymore.

Nevertheless, the idea of a harvest as an in-gathering or collection is still one most of us still understand well, and unfortunately, this year has already had its share of some harvests of a negative nature: COVID 19, deadly fires, economic and social unrest, the build up of experiences of the loss of physical connections with others and of disruptions to routines as well as a growing sense of uncertainty for the future. These are all reaping a harvest of depression and despair.

Where are you, Lord? Have you forgotten us, Lord? Are you punishing us, Lord? These are questions one asks themselves and others - and I have heard my share of them from you.

It's easy and convenient to blame or question the Lord for His action or inaction in these situations, but it might serve us better to look closer to home. This good earth God created for us is not perfect anymore because of our sin, and many of the consequences of our sin have more to do with God 'acting' in 'natural law' than with God acting out of His relationship with us. Ignoring establishing justice and fairness in societies; exploitation of natural resources out of greed and/or ignorance; delusion and failure to use our God-given sense and senses - these all bring their own 'harvest' of fruits. The prophets warn of these throughout and St. Paul, too, reminds us in Galatians 6: "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap."

But the God we know who created heaven and earth is 'slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love' - something we can read in over a dozen places in Scripture, from Exodus 34:6 throughout the prophets and psalms all the way to James. And in Ezekiel 18:32 we read God saying that "I have no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Lord God; so turn, and live." In fact, in sending Jesus, we see God whose whole mission is to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10.)

Of course God does judge us and will punish sin, whether that comes through a natural consequence of forgetting His creation has laws or because of some moral or 'religious' sin that only He - besides one's self - sees and knows. But in the vision of Himself God gives us in Jesus, we know that He forgives, as well, and that, as He says in Jeremiah 29:11 - "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." For us to live these fully, we need to 'turn,' that is, repent, 'and live' in faith that He is in charge of all of our needs, but not necessarily our wants, since many of those are idolatrous, and He alone would be our God, since He alone is God.

May we become more aware of that rich harvest of grace He gives us each day this harvest season. Amen.

REOPENING TRINITY

We're back! Well, only 50 people at a time, in accord with the state mandate for religious services. Each week, we have people who support the Worship Service (including Pastor, Elders, Musicians, audio and video engineers) who are automatically entered onto the attendance list. Then, we open up the list to members who wish to attend.

We are sanitizing the church building after uses; however, the evolving science on the virus points toward the main means of transmission to be from breathing out the virus from an infected person, and another person breathing it in. Therefore, we are requesting that all those who attend, utilize a face covering as mandated by the Oregon Health Authority. This includes either a face mask (many styles available) or a face shield (primarily for those who struggle to breathe with a face mask). The state's website includes a statement that disability is not an excuse not to wear a mask or other face covering. Please be sure to wear your mask so that it covers both your nose and mouth; face masks are not effective if not worn properly.

The online registration form has a questionnaire to fill out, regarding possible symptoms of COVID-19; we also print those questions on the front of the Sunday Bulletin and ask you to review those before you enter the Sanctuary. You may also call in to the office to register to attend church. We respectfully request that you plan on attending no more than once every three weeks, while we gauge the demand for church attendance, and we will adjust once we have a handle on the demand level. As we don't have an automatic cut-off on the online registration, we may contact people who are at the end of the list, after it reaches 50, to come on a later Sunday. We will enter any "overflow" people at the top of the following Sunday's list, and let them know.

When you come on Sundays:

- Drive in and park as normal. Please put your mask on before leaving your car (or we have disposable masks available).
- Walk up to the front of the church, come in through the open doors. If there is a line, please observe proper physical distancing. Please use hand sanitizer when you enter.
- Check in with the person at the door (if you are not on the list, or not willing to wear a proper face covering, you will be invited to return on a later Sunday).
- Read through the COVID-19 symptom checklist on the front of the bulletin. If you have any symptoms, please inform the person checking people in, and leave.
- There will be a basket in the Narthex for donations; please feel free to drop an envelope into the basket. They will be deposited into the safe when the Worship Service begins.
- Areas are marked in the church for various-sized family groups. Please sit in the smallest available area that will accommodate your group. We ask that you do not combine with other groups.
- Restrooms are available before, during and after the service. We will have a monitor to allow one person into a restroom at a time, to maintain proper physical distance.
- After the service, Elders will dismiss the congregation, row by row, starting at the back. We ask you to leave the church without stopping in the Narthex, and walk out from the front doors (please do not stop near the doors to talk). Please continue to wear a mask until you reach your vehicle.
- On Communion Sundays, form a vehicle procession for drive-through Communion.
- *Also note, any background conversations are picked up on the livestream.*

Due to the state rules, if there are groups who wish to meet, we need to discuss what's needed to comply with those regulations for your particular group. Please do not meet without authorization. Thank you!

We thank you for your cooperation with the Governor's mandate, and for your consideration to others that you express by following the mandate.

OUTREACH: MEALS FOR THOSE IN NEED

Trinity Lutheran Church continues to provide meals once a month for two separate programs. For over 40 years, Trinity has been providing meals for one of the Transition Programs in Multnomah County. This meal outreach was started by Ralph Peterson. Ralph stepped down from his leadership role in early 2020, and handed it off to Pat Benjamin and Lee Duvinage (yes, it took *two* to fill Ralph's shoes). Also in early 2020, the location was changed from downtown Portland to a location off 17th and Milwaukie.

We have been able to actually serve the meal in person only once this year, due to the Pandemic hitting. We are continuing to prepare the meal on the 2nd Saturday of every month and taking it to them. The staff and residents then serve the meal. We look forward to the time when we can again serve the meal and spend time chit chatting with the people we are serving. The meals for Transition cost an average of \$1.75/meal.



The second program we prepare a meal for is The Father's Heart, a day shelter for homeless persons here in Oregon City. This meal is served on the Third Wednesday of every month, with meal prep being done at 6pm, the Tuesday evening before. For the same reason as above, we cannot currently serve this meal in person. This meal is taken down on Wednesday morning, portioned out into take-out boxes and given out to the people at the door. Due to the pandemic, no one is allowed inside the building. Cost for The Father's Heart meal is on average \$1.50/meal.

THE FATHER'S HEART - IMMEDIATE AND ONGOING DONATION NEEDS

Check out the immediate and ongoing needs for those who are homeless. You can drop off clothing, food, hygiene items and more at their site; please pay attention to the days and times when donations are accepted. The list is at www.tfhstreetministry.com/food-and-clothing.html. Non-perishable items may also be dropped off in the red barrel at the office entrance to the church, and they will be delivered to TFH. Please be sure to label any donations left at church, as the barrel is used to collect for several ministries.

LCMS DISASTER RESPONSE

Working through LCMS districts and congregations as well as with international Lutheran churches and other partners, LCMS Disaster Response builds capacity of the church's partners to respond to needs with Christian care. The ministry reaches out to LCMS congregations and their communities with services that include on-site assessment, emergency relief and development grants, pastoral care for LCMS church workers and members, and other resources. SUNDAY SCHOOL

For September through November:

3 yr. olds to 5th grade: we have ordered a Fall-themed family devotions book that the parents can do with their child(ren). We will have the books available for pickup at the drive-through communion time, hopefully by Oct 4th. We could mail it to anyone that can’t pick it up.

Students are welcome to attend in person at church but a mask must be worn and everyone will be social distanced. More information will be sent soon to all the Confirmation families.

High School: We are still working on a solution for our high school group, no news to report at this time but we will let you know when we have it figured out.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES | August 25, 2020

Attendees: Brian Hawkins, Troy Palmer, Melissa Deyoe, Connie Adams, Ronda Corless, John Stucky, Craig Nickles, Pastor Ted, Bob Cahill, Darla Schulte

Melissa shared a devotion from Jeremiah 29:11 about sticking to God's plan.

The July meeting minutes were approved with no changes.

Christian Education: Darla Schulte (In Attendance-No Report)

Darla reported that there were 25 participants in the online VBS. There were some packets not picked up and Darla plans to follow up on these. Advertising for VBS will continue through August and then the remaining supplies will be sold and funds used for next year's VBS or mission trips. Christian Ed has been looking into devotionals to get to families and deciding what age groups these will be for. Julie & Henrietta have met to plan for Confirmation class and Pastor noted that it is being discussed to involve the parents more on Confirmation Sunday.

Outreach: Melissa Deyoe (No report)

Only outreach expense was the monthly contribution to the district. Pastor said that he would like people to share pictures of outreach activities happening and Leanne will make a video to share.

AVIT: Paul Petrone (No Report)

Troy reported that cameras and gear have been purchased and being setup. The goal is to be able to stream not only on Facebook. Jim has been heading up the camera upgrade and eventually there will be 4 people needed to run audio and sound for the service. AVIT is still giving out DVDs of the service.

Pastor Report: Pastor Ted (In Attendance-No Report)

Pastor brought up that that County will now allow 50 people in the church building. Pastor noted that families could sit in family pods, wear masks, and there could be a sign-up to attend service in person. If there were more than 50 people signed up, the overflow would be first on the list for the following week. Pastor said there have been requests for outdoor services and he is willing to do the outdoor service or can do whatever is decided. Brian discussed the possibility of doing two services of 50 people. The Praise team could do music for one service and organist could do music for the other service. It was suggested that we start with one service and see how many sign up. Brian indicated that the Elders would need to come up with their plan and choose a date to start. Melissa noted that we should consult with J. Pat about directional routes, sign-up requirements, etc. Pastor discussed that there are opportunities for outreach for our church building. The church received an email from Unite Oregon City Schools Committee asking if our organization would like to be included in a list as an organization that has activities or services that may benefit children or families in Oregon City. Could the building be sectioned off and used for outreach? There have also been requests from families to use the building for distance learning for students. Discussion included that waivers could be signed, sanitation that would need to happen, insurance requirements, wifi capabilities, and keys/locking doors. Pastor asked if we are willing for our church to be used for this purpose and Brian answered yes. Melissa noted that we will take proposals of any kind and then Council will review the proposal. Troy added that the proposal would need to go to J. Pat and then forwarded to Council. The proposal needs to include day/time requested, space needed, table and chairs needed, use of internet, etc. If the church says yes to a proposal, there are guidelines that need to be met by the person or group using the facility. It was suggested that Carol would be the best to write up the sanitizing procedures required. Fees could be charged to cover cleaning costs or other expenses.

Pastor brought up some mission possibilities to consider supporting including a LCMS organization in Costa Rica. If we are interested, he can obtain more information regarding this mission possibility. The church could also consider a joint missionary with other churches, sponsoring missionaries, or going to mission somewhere.

Elders: John Stucky & Craig Nickles (In Attendance-See Report)

John was elected head elder with Craig volunteering to step up should John become too ill from his treatments. Dave was elected scribe. Henrietta Brooks and Nancy Brockman have an extensive list of members whom they call or visit on a regular basis. Pastor is open to visit anyone.

Elders will abide with the state mandates for building use, there have been requests for use which will be discussed later. Elders will be meeting on Sept. 6 and will discuss opening up church services for up to 50 people at a time due to current County restrictions.

Treasurer Report: Melissa Deyoe (In Attendance-See Report)

For the month ending July 31, 2020, the church reports a loss from operations of \$7,561. For the 7-month period ending July 31, 2020, the church reports an overall gain of \$35,944 from operations. There was only one deposit made in July and another made at the beginning of August. If that August deposit had been made in July, we would not have shown a loss for July. Operational expenses are down and there is nothing unusual to note. There was a contribution of \$500 given to be used for someone in need. Contributions are down but to be expected due to the status of the world. It is open enrollment time for health insurance and Melissa will review plans and send Council her recommendation. Melissa has two weeks to choose a plan.

Financial Secretary: Connie Adams (In Attendance-No Report)

Connie asked what Council would like her to report and noted that Sarah had been reporting quarterly. Connie indicated that counting has been sporadic and online giving has increased.

Property Board: Herb Meissel and Bob Cahill (In Attendance-No Report)

Bob reported that the building was washed to see the condition of the paint. The was a soft washing and done this way so moisture would not be pushed under siding as could happen in pressure washing. It was noted that the new addition has no caulking between the Hardie plank siding; Bob will have a siding contractor come look at the building to give guidance on this. Bob would like to see if the cell tower contract says anything about weeding and maintenance of land where cell tower is located. Melissa will look at the contract and report back. Tansy has been pulled and parking lot cracks were all sealed. Bob is having the contractor come back fix a few more cracks that need a little more attention. The irrigation system is up and running. There is still one area that is watered with hoses and a timer. A friend of Bob's fixed the irrigation system and performed the backflow test. To date, the church has not received a bill for this work. Bob would like to have an arborist come out to assess trees. There is still a water leak in the roof where the air conditioner unit is located. The company that came out to look at it would like church to sign up for a maintenance contract before they will fix it. The gate will be fixed including pouring concrete to straighten post, buffing and painting. There were 28 yards of bark dust put in flower beds and there is just a little more needed on one side of the building. The fire alarm sensor picked up dust as smoke and this made the alarm go off. Bob will talk to the HVAC people about this because it seems the filter should be taking care of this. Pastor noted that Bob and Herb have been at the church a couple times a week.

President: Brian Hawkins (In Attendance-No Report)

Brian discussed the opening of the church for worship and asked John if he could call an Elder's meeting to discuss. John indicated that the Elders will have a meeting on September 6th and that it could be discussed on that date. Connie nominated Brian to go to the Elder's meeting to represent Council and Troy seconded. Brian requested prayers for John and his recovery.

Vice President: Troy Palmer (In Attendance-No Report)

Unfinished Business - None

New Business - No other new business.

The next Council meeting is on September 22nd at 6:30pm. Pastor closed the meeting in prayer at 8:30pm.
