WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

February is upon us. A whole month into our new year - and if we made any, our new year resolutions.

I remember (has it only been a year??) when it was still possible to be a member of our community club in Vancouver and how attendance in our yoga classes and the Thursday evening open swimming session would already be way down from that first week in January, as people already started to 'lose the steam' of those new year resolutions. I would secretly snicker at them and wondered what they thought of themselves. Mirrors work so well when they point away from you.

And then, of course, the mirror would somehow (how is it possible??) turn back to point at me (!!). Then I would have to look at all the things in my life that I promised myself or others I would attend to or complete - all of those 'sins of commission or omission' in thought word, or deed that seem to plague all of us.

Mirrors made of glass or metal can be vicious, indeed, and can lead to despair and often to a vicious downward cycle of even more sin as a result. But there is a mirror made of flesh, too - one that sees and takes our sin and reflects back only forgiveness and love - and that is Jesus. And that mirror, instead of leading to despair, can lead to renewal of hope and regeneration if we will just let it.

February sees the beginning of Lent, a whole month when we are encouraged to look at our mirrors - both those of glass and metal but especially that one of our Savior, who in looking back at us sees someone who He loves and forgives and wants to bring back to a life of love for Him and for neighbor, which just happens to be the best life for us, too.

Our sin was taken away at great cost by a Savior who took it to the cross, but in His resurrection he raises us to new life, too - from one dead in sin to a life of joy and faith and love and service in Him.

Come Lord Jesus. Let us look for and see you again in a new way in your death and resurrection. Amen

REOPENING TRINITY

“Daddy, make it go away!” Those are words that we may have said or heard at some point in our lifetimes. And, it’s a worthwhile prayer during this pandemic. When will it end? When enough people are vaccinated, which may be anywhere from later summer to later autumn. In the meantime, we follow the guidelines that are mandated by the state, for Clackamas County.

Here’s what we are currently doing:

- We are still asking people to register to attend on Sundays, to help us keep track of who is attending at Trinity, and how many are here or planned to be here; plus, registration speeds things up on Sunday morning (a simple check-off on the list, rather than gathering information)
- Social distancing is still required at church, as are face masks.
- Because of the need for social distancing, we are utilizing every other row in the Sanctuary. This also allows for distribution of Communion in the church.
- We ask people to not congregate before or after the Worship Service in the Narthex, or just outside of the doors.

With Clackamas County’s current risk level, we can fit 76 people into the sanctuary, based on our current allowance of 25% of capacity. Once we reach that point, we begin using the Library, which allows up to 13 people to watch the television there. If we hit capacity in both the Sanctuary and the Library, then we can utilize the Diamond Room, which is set up for 11 more. When the Clackamas County risk level drops to Moderate or Lower Risk (we’re currently in Extreme Risk). When we can allow a greater percentage of capacity, then social distancing will still restrict our total capacity in the Sanctuary. Once the pandemic ends, then we can freely fill the Sanctuary.

On Sundays, we will continue (as we have since March 2020) to livestream the Sunday Worship Services on Facebook, and on Communion Sundays, to have distribution of Communion after the Worship Service for those who do not attend in person.

Sunday School continues in a modified fashion.

- The parents of younger children have received materials to use at home with their children.
- Sixth and Seventh grade Confirmation students meet either in person or on Zoom on Saturdays.
- Eighth grade Confirmation students meet either in person or on Zoom with Pastor Ted on Wednesdays.
- High School Bible Study is on Wednesday evenings with Sarah Forsythe-Insley.
- Sunday Adult Bible Study is on hiatus.

At this time, most other activities are on hiatus, with the exception of the meal preparation for Transition Projects and The Father’s Heart, occasional cookie baking sessions, and the Thursday Morning Bible Study, which takes place in the Sanctuary.

LCMS DISASTER RESPONSE

Working through LCMS districts and congregations as well as with international Lutheran churches and other partners, LCMS Disaster Response builds capacity of the church’s partners to respond to needs with Christian care. The ministry reaches out to LCMS congregations and their communities with services that include on-site assessment, emergency relief and development grants, pastoral care for LCMS church workers and members, and other resources. COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL

Trinity continues to be involved with Compassion International. Through the Sunday School program, Trinity sponsors two children, one in Indonesia and one in Rwanda.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Through February:

3 yr. olds to 5th grade: we ordered a family devotions book that the parents can do with their child(ren). We recommend that the parents share the short daily devotion with their children, use the discussion question to start a conversation, then do the short activity and finish with prayer. We can mail the book to anyone that can't pick it up.

6th and 7th grade students are invited to a Zoom meeting on Saturdays at 10am, or in person.

8th graders are meeting on Wednesdays, in person or on Zoom, studying the catechism.

Students are welcome to attend in person at church but a mask must be worn and everyone will be social distanced.

High School: Currently holding Zoom Bible Studies on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm.

OUTREACH: MEALS FOR THOSE IN NEED

What are we going to do with all those Turkeys, Hams and Hamburger that many of you so graciously donated? We are going to make filling, nutritious meals for the homeless for many months. If any of you have a great recipe for soup, stew or casserole using turkey/chicken, please send it to Pat Benjamin or Lee Duvinage. Meat is the most expensive item we have to purchase for the meals. We are more than happy to accept meat donations year around. For example, during the summer, we could oven fry chicken legs, pair it with a homemade potato salad and a tossed green salad.



On the second Saturday, of every month we prepare a meal for one of the *Transition Projects* Programs. We used to deliver to downtown Portland. Since the beginning of 2020, we have been delivering to their home just off SE McLoughlin and 17th. This housing has room for about 20 couples and is co-ed. One-fourth of the population are senior citizens (60+). They also have facilities for wheelchair bound persons.

For *The Fathers Heart*, we serve on the third Wednesday of every month with meal prep being done the Tuesday evening before. The Fathers Heart is a Christian run day shelter in Oregon City. The majority of the meals are prepared and served by churches in the local area. A few Civic organizations also prepare meals. When you serve, you are most certainly immersed in a micro-culture right here in Oregon.

Presently we cannot actually serve the food, due to Pandemic restrictions. We are committed to making sure they do not go hungry. Once the restrictions are raised, we hope many of you will be willing and able to serve. Financial donations are still welcome. Checks can be made to Trinity Lutheran Church with either Transition or TFH in the memo line. If you wish to donate to both, write Meal outreach on the memo line and the amount will be evenly divided between the two accounts.

THE FATHER'S HEART - IMMEDIATE AND ONGOING DONATION NEEDS

It's cold out there! Check out the immediate and ongoing needs for those who are homeless. You can drop off clothing, food, hygiene items and more at their site; please pay attention to the days and times when donations are accepted. Go to their home page, <https://tfhstreetministry.com/> and there's a list of what is currently needed. Or, click on the *Amazon Wish List* link to order, and it will be delivered to them. Trinity collects non-perishable items in the red barrel at the office entrance to the church. Please be sure to label any donations left at church, as the barrel is used to collect for several ministries.

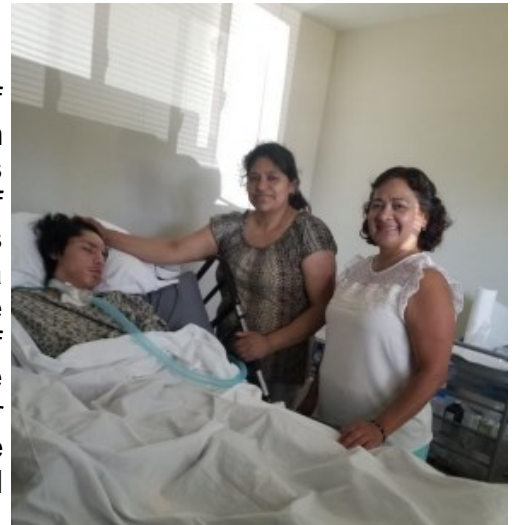
SUNDAY FLOWERS

LWML MITES SUPPORT OUTREACH GRANT

Carrying Christ into the Heart of the Hispanic Home, \$6500

The Lutheran Latino Ministries is a Recognized Service Organization of the LCMS. Since 2003, Deaconess Marta Luna has worked with Lutheran Latino Services with her husband until his passing in 2017. She has continued her mission to bring God's love into the lives and hearts of people who do not know Him, and she continues connecting families with the church. She works one day a week at Silverton Hospital as a Chaplain; in Woodburn, through the volunteer organization Love in the Name of Christ (Love INC); and throughout the week bringing the love of Christ to families in homes and hospital rooms, connecting them with the church whenever possible. Grant funds would help ensure ample time for Deaconess Marta to disciple families and keep her working at a full-time level by helping provide sustaining support for salary, mileage and communication.



QUILTERS

Since COVID-19 hasn't given up yet, we are still on hold as to scheduling our weekly quilting group gatherings. However, quilting is not completely quiet. All 31 quilts that were complete were delivered to True Housing for delivery at Christmas; they called with a sincere "Thank You." Several small quilts were added to the LOVE INC Baby Layette ministry; seven boxes of Baby Layettes were delivered prior to the holidays. The purple quilt offered for a donation found a new home; the new owner made a generous donation of \$250 to the church for the Quilters. The peach and brown lap-size quilt is still available.

During our time at home, many folks have indulged in sorting and re-organizing, and that has included fabric stashes! We have had multiple bags of fabric donated from Gail Allen, Dani Schmidt, and the estate of Gillian Marshall. Also donated are a sewing machine and a Cricket applique cutting machine. It will take some sorting to organize these items into the Quilter's Room storage and lots of creative ideas on what to create from all the new additions.

During our break, and at the urging of Will Marshall who brought a newspaper clipping on quilt care, I finally prepared and mailed 'Care Instruction' cards (similar to the cards delivered with each charity quilt) for all the Trinity recipients of the Quilt of Valor quilts. I included a copy of the newspaper clipping with each card and will post a copy in the Quilt Room.

In arranging for the Blessing of the Quilts, Pastor Ted said he did not know much about quilts except that they were pretty and comforting. I wrote him, one educator to another, a brief tutorial on quilting.

On the Sunday that quilts were presented to the church for a blessing, Pastor Ted had a very nice prayer for the Blessing of the Quilts. He said he did not write it but 'adapted' from a prayer, written by someone at Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Grafton, Iowa, for quilts made for Lutheran World Relief. I have a typed copy which I will frame and hang in the Quilt Room. I have to believe that this prayer was written by a quilter!

Just a reminder that the 'challenge block' for this year is the 12" (finished) eight-point star block. While we cannot meet, if you can make a couple of these and bring them in when we gather next, we can create a new top for our new collection of charity quilts. If you need fabric, please stop by the Quilt Room and collect what you need; ask at the office for admittance.

Until we can quilt together again, be safe, stay healthy, and pray for each other and our country as we take on 2021.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH | COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES | November 17, 2020

Attendees: Brian Hawkins, Troy Palmer, Melissa Deyoe, Connie Adams, Ronda Corless, Craig Nickles, Pastor Ted, Darla Schulte.

Troy shared a devotion by Hal Seed about the coronavirus and what if the church ceased to exist? The fear is that Christians will get used to not going to church. We need to be a part of online church and not take church for granted, we need the church.

The October meeting minutes were approved with no changes.

Christian Education: Darla Schulte (In Attendance-No Report) The Christian Ed board had a meeting last week. Darla reported that the *My Devotions* for the Sunday School were well received and they will purchase the December-February plus an Advent calendar. In-church Sunday School will probably not be considered until at least January. Sarah has had four high school bible study attendees. Confirmation has had good attendance, Pastor Ted is currently teaching this class. The 6th/7th grade class is making their own Advent calendars in their Saturday morning class.

Outreach: Pastor Ted (In Attendance-No report) Outreach met and included in their discussion was getting a foreign missionary to support. Pastor Ted has been in touch with *Habitat for Humanity* to do a Trinity OC day, but this will need planning to happen. Pastor reported that there is good energy going on in Outreach. Prayers requested for Ralph.

Council discussed the Advent/Lent offerings and decided that the Council would make the determination this year that these offerings will continue to go to the Father's Heart and Love, Inc. Troy asked Melissa if we have the funds to round up to \$500 if less than that is donated and Melissa confirmed there are funds available to do so.

AVIT: Paul Petrone (No Report) Troy reported that they are still running through sound board problems. They replaced the stage box and that did not fix the issue. It was good for about two months but the problem of the sound cutting out is now getting worse. AVIT will try different cables and then they will look at the mixer. Repairs will be covered by the company that installed the sound board.

Pastor Report: Pastor Ted (In Attendance-No Report) Pastor Ted explained that for the Thanksgiving service and Advent services, he will prepare a devotion, record it post it on Trinity's Facebook page. He is requesting help with some music, maybe have musicians sing something that can be added in. Pastor reported that he teaches a Thursday morning Bible study here at the church.

Elders: John Stucky & Craig Nickles (In Attendance-No Report) Craig reported that the Elders met on November 15th and talked about the facility, COVID and the recent shutdown. There are not many participating in meeting in the Diamond room to watch service there. Due to the current government restriction of 25, the service will only be satellite for the next two weeks or however long it's required. As noted above, there will not be in person Thanksgiving or Advent services this year, Pastor will be recording a devotion instead. Craig reported that they discussed Sunday School for adults and are talking about how to start this or do a zoom meeting. So far, the weather on Communion Sundays has been without rain but they expect rain at some point and will have tents or umbrellas when needed.

Treasurer Report: Melissa Deyoe (In Attendance-See Report) For the month ending October 31, 2020, the church reports a loss from operations of \$1,284. For the 10-month period ending October 31, 2020, the church reports an overall gain of \$36,970 from operations. Melissa reported that Lee made a request for the holiday outreach and wants to change to gift cards for this year. Melissa asked Council for approval of \$4,000, less money donated by others, to go towards the holiday outreach and to be split between Council Special Funds and Outreach restricted funds. Council approved this request. The credit card rewards were used to buy beef for the shelter meals and Council discussed and agrees that these rewards should

be used to buy beef again.

Alma Allen emailed and asked what we are doing for the 100 year celebration because there was not a budget line for this. Brian suggested that a budget can be proposed for the 100 year celebration and council will review and Council Special Funds could be used for these expenses. It was also discussed that at the congregation meeting Carol Wilson asked if there was money available for flowers if there was a week no one signed up to donate them. Melissa reported that there are funds available for flowers and Council Special Funds could be used if needed. Connie said that in the past you could donate money specifically to go to the Flower Fund.

Melissa reported that OSHA released a generic form that J. Pat filled in with our names and is a policy that states what to do if a COVID case should arise. She also indicated that the contract with J. Pat for services was only signed for one year and is up for renewal. Melissa said that she will send J. Pat an email to see if he has any changes and will then bring it to Council to get approval to renew. Troy suggested that we stick with a one year contract due to the times we are in. Pastor suggested that whoever signs the contract with J. Pat shows him our appreciation for all he does.

Financial Secretary: Connie Adams (In Attendance-No Report) Connie reported that counting is being done twice a month. She needs a head counter and another counting team. The counters would need to know how to use excel.

Connie discussed that Thrivent action funds were requested for the Christmas giving tree. Someone could make a request for Thrivent action funds for the food for the Christmas giving but not for the gifts because they won't give to the same one twice. Craig mentioned that Lou Miller is not our Trinity Thrivent rep but Craig will email Lou and see if he would educate us on giving choice dollars and action fund money.

Property Board: Herb Meissel and Bob Cahill (Not in Attendance-No Report) Melissa and Connie reported that the mailbox is leaking and the mail is getting wet. This includes checks and other important mail. Melissa said she let the Property Board know that it is leaking. Brian announced that Bob is resigning from the property board effective December 1, 2020. Bob is talking to Herb about stepping up to be the head of the Properties Board. Bob will be missed, there were many projects completed in the past year and a half when Bob was in charge.

President: Brian Hawkins (In Attendance-No Report)

Vice President: Troy Palmer (In Attendance-No Report) Troy asked if there is any reason to have a December meeting and that traditionally Council has not met in December. Craig added that the Elders will meet about the COVID rules. Troy suggested that when the minutes are sent out mid December, that we can discuss if there is anything at that time that would require us to meet.

Unfinished Business

Council discussed the Congregation meeting and adding a note in the bulletin regarding approving Lou Miller as the congregation delegate, approval of the May congregation meeting minutes including a copy of the minutes, and that Council made a determination for the Advent/Lent offerings to continue to go to the Father's Heart and Love, Inc for this year.

New Business

No other new business.

There will not be a December Council meeting, the next meeting will be on January 19th at 6:30pm. Devotion at the next meeting will be from Craig Nickles. Pastor closed the meeting in prayer at 8:15pm.
