WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

"But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. 1 Corinthians 15:20-22

Lent is finally over and Easter is here. "He is risen" will be our shout, and "He is risen, indeed" the refrain in answer. Penitence and looking inward at ourselves and our need for a Savior give way to the joy of remembering our Savior is here. He is here, indeed, and He takes away our sin and gives us His righteousness, which means we are able to stand before God confident of our salvation.

Yes, that's all true. And that is good news, indeed! But that good news for us came at a great price - the price that our Savior Jesus had to pay on Good Friday for our sins. That, too, we remember during these days. We remember how He was at first feted but then turned on. How He first heard the words "Hail the Messiah," but then heard 'Crucify Him." Those last words were spoken by the religious and secular leaders of the day, but by the people - His own people - as well.

That not so good result for Jesus, which He willingly submitted to, was for our sins, too. We are all responsible for that.

We participated in that event in another way, however - though a much less painful way than Jesus did - as St. Paul also reminds us: "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." *Romans 6:4*

That "newness of life" is perhaps best described by St. John: "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:9-11

May God continue to work this love in and through us. Amen.

NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL VOTERS MEETING: SUNDAY, MAY 16, 12:30 pm

We will be electing for two positions on the Church Council: Vice President and Treasurer, as well as two Elder positions. (the positions of both Jeff Allen and Dave Wilson are ending).

Both Troy Palmer and Melissa Deyoe have "termed out" from their positions and cannot be re-elected, so we are looking for suitable replacements for them.

Treasurer:

Term is 2 years. Below are the typical Treasury duties:

- Perform weekly invoice receipt, bill pay and payment authorization requests to submit to accountants.
- Perform monthly bank statement reconciliation, and document submittal to accountants for monthly financial statement preparation.
- Review monthly financial statements for inaccuracies and prepare document for council meeting
- 11 Council meetings January through November review financials from prior month, and discuss any financial situations with council
- Two congregation meetings presentations May is a recap of the prior year end; November is a quick summary of the current year and the Budget recommendation.
- Maintain payroll and benefits for employees.
 (Accountants process payroll, but we monitor it)
- Maintain subcontractor forms and payment schedules
- Maintain Insurance paperwork
- Maintain district form reporting
- · Additional items as needed

Vice President:

The description from page 12 of the Bylaws The Vice President shall:

- Preside at all of the meeting of the church council;
- Perform the duties of the office of the president in the absence or at the request of the president;
- Conduct annual Performance Reviews of contract employees as directed by the church council and submit a written report to the Recording Secretary and to the individual

Term is 2 years. Below are the typical VP duties

- Chair the Council meetings and agenda
- Meetings are typically at 6:30 pm and last 1.5 -2 hours (This can always be negotiated if something comes up)
- 11 Council meetings January November (December is too busy to fit another in)
- There are two congregation meetings. One in May, and one in November. The president runs the agenda and chairs congregation meetings. The VP is there for input and support.

Treasurer would be an ideal position for someone with a bookkeeping or accounting background, or who has managed a small business. Feel free to contact Melissa Deyoe to talk about this position.

DAY OF DOING - LOTS GOT DONE!

Around 70 people showed up on Sunday, March 14, to take part in the "Day of Doing." There were people working outside on ice storm clean-up, trimming broken branches from trees and removing fallen branches. The sidewalk along the front of the church was power washed, and there was a big bonfire out back to get rid of the yard debris. Also, blackberry bushes were removed from some areas, and big limbs that fell along Henrici Road were removed. The place was buzzing with chain saws!

Inside the church building, the activity matched the energy level outside. Carolyn Stucky led a group who were creating mats for the homeless out of plastic grocery bags; a learn-by-doing project. Food that had been collected was sorted by Connie Adams and a group of volunteers. Lee Duvinage led a group of men and women who cleaned the kitchen and organized the storeroom. In the Library, Alana Morgan and Nancy Brockmann headed a group making cards for shut-ins and volunteer groups, The Father's Heart and other outreach programs. In the Jade Room, Jacqueline Noel led a group who were creating "Blessing Bags," which can be passed out to homeless people. The Quilters led a demonstration of their work as they worked on quilts. Craig Nickles led a group who cleaned and organized the attic.

A big THANK YOU to everyone who participated in the Day of Doing, as well as those who have brought donations for our outreach efforts.

REOPENING TRINITY

Clackamas County continues to report a lower number of COVID-19 infections. That's great news, but it needs to continue in order for the County to drop into a more permissive category.

What does that mean for Trinity?

- We are still asking people to register to attend on Sundays, to help us keep track of who is attending at Trinity, and how many are here or planned to be here; plus, registration speeds things up on Sunday morning (a simple check-off on the list, rather than gathering information)
- Social distancing is still required at church, as are face masks.
- Because of the need for social distancing, we are utilizing every other row in the Sanctuary. This also allows for distribution of Communion in the church.
- We ask people to not congregate before or after the Worship Service in the Narthex, or just outside of the doors.

Although we technically can allow up to 150 people in the Sanctuary, we still have to observe the six-foot barrier between people or family groups. Larger families can sit across a row, but for all others, we still need four chairs between groups in a row, which gives us roughly the same limitation on how many people we can allow into the Sanctuary. We can still use other areas for overflow, and will look at how we can work things for Easter, partly depending on the county's risk category at that time.

On Sundays, we will continue (as we have since March 2020) to livestream the Sunday Worship Services on Facebook, and on Communion Sundays, to have distribution of Communion after the Worship Service for those who do not attend in person. At this point, we're not planning on discontinuing the livestream on Sunday, even after the pandemic ends.

Sunday School continues in a modified fashion.

- The parents of younger children have received materials to use at home with their children.
- Sixth and Seventh grade Confirmation students meet either in person or on Zoom on Saturdays.
- Eighth grade Confirmation students meet either in person or on Zoom with Pastor Ted on Wednesdays.
- High School Bible Study is on Wednesday evenings with Sarah Forsythe-Insley.
- Sunday Adult Bible Studies take place on the second and fourth Sundays of the month in the Sanctuary.
- The Fourth Sunday Women's Bible Study continues.

At this time, most other activities are still on hiatus, with the exception of the meal preparation for Transition Projects and The Father's Heart, occasional cookie baking sessions, and the Thursday Morning Bible Study, which takes place in the Sanctuary.

LCMS DISASTER RESPONSE

Working through LCMS districts and congregations as well as with international Lutheran churches and other partners, LCMS Disaster Response builds capacity of the church's partners to respond to needs with Christian care. The ministry reaches out to LCMS congregations and their communities with services that include on-site assessment, emergency relief and development grants, pastoral care for LCMS church workers and members, and other resources. COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL

Trinity continues to be involved with Compassion International. Through the Sunday School program, Trinity sponsors two children, one in Indonesia and one in Rwanda.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Through April:

3 yr. olds to 5th grade: we ordered a family devotions book that the parents can do with their child(ren). We recommend that the parents share the short daily devotion with their children, use the discussion question to start a conversation, then do the short activity and finish with prayer. We can mail the book to anyone that can't pick it up.

6th and 7th grade Confirmation students are invited to a Zoom meeting on Saturdays at 10:00 am, or in person. Please be sure to sign in and sanitize your hands.

8th graders are meeting on Wednesdays, in person or on Zoom, studying the catechism. Don't forget to sign in and sanitize.

High School: Zoom Bible Studies on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm with Sarah Forsythe-Insley.

OUTREACH: MEALS FOR THOSE IN NEED

What are we going to do with all those Turkeys, Hams and Hamburger that many of you so graciously donated? We are going to make filling, nutritious meals for the homeless for many months. If any of you have a great recipe for soup, stew or casserole using turkey/chicken, please send it to Pat Benjamin or Lee Duvinage. Meat is the most expensive item we have to purchase for the meals. We are more than happy to accept meat donations year around. For example, during the summer, we could oven fry chicken legs, pair it with a homemade potato salad and a tossed green salad.



On the second Saturday of every month we prepare a meal for one of the *Transition Projects* Programs. We used to deliver to downtown Portland. Since the beginning of 2020, we have been delivering to their home just off SE McLoughlin and 17th. This housing has room for about 20 couples and is co-ed. One-fourth of the population are senior citizens (60+). They also have facilities for wheelchair bound persons.

For *The Fathers Heart*, we serve on the third Wednesday of every month with meal prep being done the Tuesday evening before. The Fathers Heart is a Christian run day shelter in Oregon City. The majority of the meals are prepared and served by churches in the local area. A few Civic organizations also prepare meals. When you serve, you are most certainly immersed in a micro-culture right here in Oregon.

Presently we cannot actually serve the food, due to Pandemic restrictions. We are committed to making sure they do not go hungry. Once the restrictions are raised, we hope many of you will be willing and able to serve. Financial donations are still welcome. Checks can be made to Trinity Lutheran Church with either Transition or TFH in the memo line. If you wish to donate to both, write Meal outreach on the memo line and the amount will be evenly divided between the two accounts.

THE FATHER'S HEART - IMMEDIATE AND ONGOING DONATION NEEDS

It's cold out there! Check out the immediate and ongoing needs for those who are homeless. You can drop off clothing, food, hygiene items and more at their site; please pay attention to the days and times when donations are accepted. Go to their home page, https://tfhstreetministry.com/ and there's a list of what is currently needed. Or, click on the *Amazon Wish List* link to order, and it will be delivered to them. Trinity collects non-perishable items in the red barrel at the office entrance to the church. Please be sure to label any donations left at church, as the barrel is used to collect for several ministries.

LWML MITES SUPPORT OUTREACH GRANT Expanding the Dominican Republic Disability Ministry as God's Word and Jesus' Love is Shared, \$6500

Grant monies from this project continue to support the group home for six teenagers with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). In addition, it will make possible expanding the outreach of the newly formed Dominican Lutheran Church into government institutions housing children and adults with IDD, where training is given to staff and visits from church members share the love of Jesus through Bible stories, songs, visiting and personal interactions with the people and employees. The government is asking for help in this area. The long-term goal: change the way the Dominican Republic



society and government view and care for people with IDD.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH | COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES | February 24, 2021

Attendees: Brian Hawkins, Troy Palmer, Melissa Deyoe, Ronda Corless, Craig Nickles, Darla Schulte, Herb Meissel. Craig opened the meeting with a devotion from the book "Closer to God each Day" focusing on Isaiah 40:31 and trusting God.

The January meeting minutes were approved as presented.

Christian Education: Darla Schulte (Present-No Report) Darla reported that My Devotions, Trivia and "Lentagram" materials were ordered for the Sunday School. The High Schoolers are doing a study with a Harry Potter & the Deathly Hollow theme. VBS materials will be ordered soon.

Outreach: Craig Nickles (Present-No Report)

Craig reported that the Outreach committee has been meeting monthly. The next three Sundays will be focused on missions. The next three weeks will be mission focused. On February 28th, Pastor will share about his ministry in Vietnam. On March 7th, there will be a video showing what we do as outreach in our congregation. We will also honor Ralph Peterson that day for the outreach and ministry he was involved in for so many years. The Day of Doing is scheduled for Sunday March 14th and there will be sign-up sheets in the Narthex for projects that need done and for who will be attending. Herb will make a list of the projects that need done. Outreach has been in touch with Thrivent and asked if they will donate funds and T shirts for the Day of Doing.

AVIT: Paul Petrone (Not Present-No Report)

Troy said there was nothing new to report and things are working good after the power outages.

Pastor Report: Pastor Ted (Not Present-See Report)

Craig reported for Pastor. Lenten midweek services will be in person and not broadcasted. The next three weeks will be mission focused. For the Day of Doing on March 14th, Pastor would like our whole-hearted support and thanks everyone in advance. We are now in moderate risk per the county and can have 150 people in the sanctuary, but this may vary depending on seating arrangements. The Costa Rica mission is in need of funding at this point and eventually we might be able to go there to help. They are in need of teachers. Brian requested that there be a presentation on the Costa Rica Mission.

Elders: Craig Nickles (Present-No Report)

Craig reported that Al Bohr is a new Elder and Craig is now Head Elder. The Elders have made calls on the membership list so the roster and directory can be updated.

Treasurer Report: Melissa Deyoe (Present-See Report)

For the month ending January 31, 2021, the church reports a loss from operations of \$5,529. Melissa noted the January cell tower payment was deposited in December 2020. She requested that we move \$500 from Outreach to Transition Meals, as was done in the prior year. Craig made a motion and Troy seconded the motion and it was unanimous to transfer \$500 from Outreach to Transition Meals. The cash back rewards from the visa credit card of \$250 was received. Last year the amount was used for office supplies and beef for The Father's Heart meals. Melissa recommended we do

the same with the money this year and Council agreed. As of December 31, 2020, there was -\$200 in Restricted Organ Funds, which was for the maintenance of the organ. Melissa recommended that she do a journal entry to clear this from the restricted fund and Council agreed.

Financial Secretary: Connie Adams (Not Present-No Report)

Property Board: Herb Meissel (Present-No Report)

Herb reported that he has been working on finding the leaks in the roof and needs to try and be at the church when it is raining. The ice storm caused some of the gutters to come unattached from the building and Herb will get some bids for anchoring the gutters. Melissa will reach out to the insurance company to see if there is anything they can do for repairs needed from the ice storm. Herb would like to be there when the adjustor comes. Brian would like Melissa and Herb to let him know when they get a resolution. Herb noted that the wall insulation in the gym is sagging and needs replaced. Brian asked if we should have an arborist assess if some of the trees should come out for safety. Herb agreed and will have an arborist come look. Herb needs a list of people who would be willing to help when he needs help with repairs. Being on the list doesn't obligate someone for all repairs, but having a list of several people will be helpful in case someone isn't available. Craig noted that the upstairs will need to be sorted through to determine what should be kept. Melissa wants to be there to go through financial boxes to make sure that what is kept matches retention requirements.

President: Brian Hawkins (Present-No Report)

Brian would like the Council members whose term will expire this year to give recommendations for their replacement. The upcoming vacancies on council will be the Treasurer and Vice President. Ronda will ask J. Pat to announce in the weekly bulletin that these positions will need to be filled and that we need a list of people for Herb to call when he needs help with property and building repairs.
