## WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

24 (Jesus says) Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. 25 Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. 26 If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him. *John 12:24-26*

May is upon us and with it, Spring is already in full force.

Spring brings with it new life in so many ways - bulbs in the ground become flowers and seeds in it burst out in new plants. Trees are getting their leaves back in some cases following up on glorious blooms of so many colors. New life for a new year - another Anno Domini or Year of our Lord.

All of the newness in Springtime is actually just a time of transition. Life is a cycle which continues on to eternity. Our congregation has seen and will see lots of transition this year, too. ## **NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL VOTERS MEETING: SUNDAY, MAY 16, 12:30 pm**

We will be electing for two positions on the Church Council: Vice President and Treasurer, as well as two Elder positions. (the positions of both Jeff Allen and Dave Wilson are ending).

Both Troy Palmer and Melissa Deyoe have “termed out” from their positions and cannot be re-elected, so we are looking for suitable replacements for them.

### **Treasurer:**

Term is 2 years. Below are the typical Treasury duties:

- Perform weekly invoice receipt, bill pay and payment authorization requests to submit to accountants.
- Perform monthly bank statement reconciliation, and document submittal to accountants for monthly financial statement preparation.
- Review monthly financial statements for inaccuracies and prepare document for council meeting
- 11 Council meetings - January through November - review financials from prior month, and discuss any financial situations with council
- Two congregation meetings presentations - May is a recap of the prior year end; November is a quick summary of the current year and the Budget recommendation.
- Maintain payroll and benefits for employees. (Accountants process payroll, but we monitor it)
- Maintain subcontractor forms and payment schedules
- Maintain Insurance paperwork
- Maintain district form reporting
- Additional items as needed

### **Vice President:**

The description from page 12 of the Bylaws  
The Vice President shall:

- Preside at all of the meeting of the church council;
- Perform the duties of the office of the president in the absence or at the request of the president;
- Conduct annual Performance Reviews of contract employees as directed by the church council and submit a written report to the Recording Secretary and to the individual

*Term is 2 years. Below are the typical VP duties*

- Chair the Council meetings and agenda
- Meetings are typically at 6:30 pm and last 1.5 - 2 hours (This can always be negotiated if something comes up)
- 11 Council meetings - January - November (December is too busy to fit another in)
- There are two congregation meetings. One in May, and one in November. The president runs the agenda and chairs congregation meetings. The VP is there for input and support.

Treasurer would be an ideal position for someone with a bookkeeping or accounting background, or who has managed a small business. Feel free to contact Melissa Deyoe to talk about this position.

### **DAY OF DOING - LOTS GOT DONE!**

Most of us have carried groceries into our homes. You may be good with one bag at a time, some people can do two in their arms, and the bags with handles make carrying two much easier. Some bags are light and some are heavy.

Have you ever thought about how many bags it takes to contain over 800 pounds of groceries? Through the season of Lent, Trinity members contributed 817 pounds of groceries to help restock the shelves of the church food pantries in the area. Oregon City Methodist Church received 277 pounds of groceries, First Evangelical Presbyterian Church of Oregon City received 294 pounds, and St. John the Apostle Catholic Church received 246 pounds. In addition to food donated by individuals and churches, these churches also distribute USDA food products to those in need in our area.

A big THANK YOU to everyone who participated in the Day of Doing, as well as those who have brought donations for our outreach efforts. We will continue to collect canned and boxed, non-perishable items to help keep the food pantry shelves stocked.

## **REOPENING TRINITY**

Is it starting to feel like there's a revolving door? First things are going poorly, then they improve, then there's another surge and they are doing poorly again.

What does that mean for Trinity?

- Since we're back in the Extreme Risk category, we can only allow 77 people in the sanctuary.
- Social distancing is still required at church, as are face masks for all.
- We are still asking people to register to attend on Sundays, to help us keep track of who is attending at Trinity, and how many are here or planned to be here; plus, registration speeds things up on Sunday morning (a simple check-off on the list, rather than gathering information)
- Because of the need for social distancing, we are utilizing every other row in the Sanctuary. This also allows for distribution of Communion in the church.
- We ask people to not congregate before or after the Worship Service in the Narthex, or just outside of the doors.

Larger families can sit across a row, but for all others, we still need four chairs between groups in a row, which gives us roughly the same limitation on how many people we can allow into the Sanctuary. We can still use other areas for overflow.

We will continue to livestream the Sunday Worship Services on Facebook, and on Communion Sundays, to have distribution of Communion after the Worship Service for those who do not attend in person. At this point, we're not planning on discontinuing the livestream on Sunday, even after the pandemic ends.

Sunday School continues in a modified fashion.

- The parents of younger children have received materials to use at home with their children.
- Sixth and Seventh grade Confirmation students meet either in person or on Zoom on Saturdays.
- Eighth grade Confirmation students meet either in person or on Zoom with Pastor Ted on Wednesdays.
- High School Bible Study is on Thursday evenings with Sarah Forsythe-Insley during the school year.
- Sunday Adult Bible Studies take place on the second and fourth Sundays of the month in the Sanctuary.
- The Fourth Sunday Women's Bible Study continues; the next study is "Living a Chocolate Life." Contact Carolyn Stucky for details/to order the materials.

At this time, most other activities are still on hiatus, with the exception of the meal preparation for Transition Projects and The Father's Heart, occasional cookie baking sessions, and the Thursday Morning Bible Study, which takes place in the Sanctuary or Narthex.

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## **LCMS DISASTER RESPONSE**

Working through LCMS districts and congregations as well as with international Lutheran churches and other partners, LCMS Disaster Response builds capacity of the church's partners to respond to needs with Christian care. The ministry reaches out to LCMS congregations and their communities with services that include on-site assessment, emergency relief and development grants, pastoral care for LCMS church workers and members, and other resources. 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## **COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL**

Trinity continues to be involved with Compassion International. Through the Sunday School program, Trinity sponsors two children, one in Indonesia and one in Rwanda.

## **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

**Through April:**

*3 yr. olds to 5th grade:* we ordered a family devotions book that the parents can do with their child(ren). We recommend that the parents share the short daily devotion with their children, use the discussion question to start a conversation, then do the short activity and finish with prayer. We can mail the book to anyone that can't pick it up.

*6th and 7th grade Confirmation students* are invited to a Zoom meeting on Saturdays at 10:00 am, or in person. Please be sure to sign in and sanitize your hands.

*8th graders* are meeting on Wednesdays, in person or on Zoom, studying the catechism. Don't forget to sign in and sanitize.

*High School:* Zoom Bible Studies on Thursday evenings at 8:00 pm with Sarah Forsythe-Insley.

## **OUTREACH: MEALS FOR THOSE IN NEED**

What are we going to do with all those Turkeys, Hams and Hamburger that many of you so graciously donated? We are going to make filling, nutritious meals for the homeless for many months. If any of you have a great recipe for soup, stew or casserole using turkey/chicken, please send it to Pat Benjamin or Lee Duvinage. Meat is the most expensive item we have to purchase for the meals. We are more than happy to accept meat donations year around. For example, during the summer, we could oven fry chicken legs, pair it with a homemade potato salad and a tossed green salad.



On the second Saturday of every month we prepare a meal for one of the *Transition Projects* Programs. We used to deliver to downtown Portland. Since the beginning of 2020, we have been delivering to their home just off SE McLoughlin and 17th. This housing has room for about 20 couples and is co-ed. One-fourth of the population are senior citizens (60+). They also have facilities for wheelchair bound persons.

For *The Fathers Heart*, we serve on the third Wednesday of every month with meal prep being done the Tuesday evening before. The Fathers Heart is a Christian run day shelter in Oregon City. The majority of the meals are prepared and served by churches in the local area. A few Civic organizations also prepare meals. When you serve, you are most certainly immersed in a micro-culture right here in Oregon.

Presently we cannot actually serve the food, due to Pandemic restrictions. We are committed to making sure they do not go hungry. Once the restrictions are raised, we hope many of you will be willing and able to serve. Financial donations are still welcome. Checks can be made to Trinity Lutheran Church with either Transition or TFH in the memo line. If you wish to donate to both, write Meal outreach on the memo line and the amount will be evenly divided between the two accounts.

## **THE FATHER'S HEART - IMMEDIATE AND ONGOING DONATION NEEDS**

It's cold out there! Check out the immediate and ongoing needs for those who are homeless. You can drop off clothing, food, hygiene items and more at their site; please pay attention to the days and times when donations are accepted. Go to their home page, <https://tfhstreetministry.com/> and there's a list of what is currently needed. Or, click on the *Amazon Wish List* link to order, and it will be delivered to them. Trinity collects non-perishable items in the red barrel at the office entrance to the church. Please be sure to label any donations left at church, as the barrel is used to collect for several ministries.

## LWML MITES SUPPORT OUTREACH GRANT

### Filling Haitian Tummies Opens Ears to the Gospel, \$5000

The goal of this grant is for Trinity HOPE to reach the children in the Lutheran Schools in Haiti with the Word of the Lord by providing a nutritious meal during the school day which enables them to be fed spiritually and witness first-hand Christ's love for them. An estimated 62% of the Haitian population suffers from



malnutrition; for many poor Haitian children, this is their only meal for the day. With this physical need met, they are able to be fed spiritually, becoming young missionaries to their families. This grant would provide a noon meal for 110 children at a Lutheran school in Haiti for an entire school year.

## TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH | COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES | March 23, 2021

**Attendees:** Brian Hawkins, Troy Palmer, Melissa Deyoe, Ronda Corless, Craig Nickles, Darla Schulte, Herb Meissel, Pastor Ted.

Troy shared a devotion about prayer and praying for God's will. The devotion referenced John 5:13-15 and John 14:14.

The February meeting minutes were approved as presented.

**Christian Education:** Darla Schulte (Present/No Report)

Darla reported that the Sunday school devotions are taken care of through May. VBS registration will open in May and there will not be any meals this year but a packaged snack instead.

**Outreach:** Craig Nickles (Present/No Report)

Craig reported that there was a great turnout for the Day of Doing and there have been suggestions to do more workdays like this. It was requested for pictures from the Day of Doing be sent to Ahtia to be displayed on the Facebook Live before service starts and information including how many people were there etc., could be included. The Outreach committee discussed some other church activities that could be started such as volleyball, church picnic, and Adopt a Road. Ronda volunteered to get more information about Adopt a Road. Pastor volunteered to organize a volleyball night. Pastor asked who organizes activities and pointed out that it can't just be the Outreach committee. Craig said he and Pastor talked about finding out what our members' gifts/skills are. Connie suggested that we need a volunteer coordinator or a couple people as volunteer coordinators. Darla suggested that we send out a survey through ChurchTeams asking members what their talents are. Connie will look for the survey that Love, Inc. uses. We will come up with a list of talents to include on the survey at the list at the next council meeting. Lee requested that there be at least one youth member to join the Outreach Committee.

Pastor asked what kind of resources we might have to commit to the Costa Rica ministry? It is an LCMS ministry focused on education and in need of teachers. They train and educate girls so they will have other ways of making money than sex trafficking and drugs, which is common there because it is the fastest way of making money. Pastor said our high schoolers could start communication as pen pals with the kids in Costa Rica and it would be good for our young people to get a taste for missions. Melissa responded that Outreach could request an amount to send to the Costa Rica ministry and bring this proposal to Council. This ministry could be discussed at the congregation meeting as well. It was suggested that Pastor and someone else go to Costa Rica to learn more about the ministry to bring back information to our congregation. Pastor offered to pay his own way. Connie suggested that Outreach should discuss this further and decide what they want to do and then bring it back to Council. Then the plan could be presented to the congregation and it can be determined who would go to Costa Rica with Pastor. We should ask the congregation what information they would want brought back from Costa Rica about the ministry. Pastor noted that we want to be able to commit resources to this ministry for so many years so the ministry will know they can rely on the support.

**AVIT:** Paul Petrone (Not Present/No Report)

**Pastor Report:** Pastor Ted (Present/No Report)

**Elders:** Craig Nickles (In Attendance/No Report)

Craig reported that the Elders have called their members and have been in touch with members each month. There will be a Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and one Easter service. It will be important for streaming the services to continue. Upcoming positions to fill are two Elder positions, Vice President and Treasurer. There was conversation about getting the word out that these positions will need filled and include it in the bulletin and scroll. The church directory has been emailed and is also available in the narthex.

**Treasurer Report:** Melissa Deyoe (Present/See Report)

For the month ending February 28, 2021, the church reports a gain from operations of \$4,457. For the two month period ending February 28, 2021, the church reports an overall loss of \$1,072 from operations.

**Financial Secretary:** Connie Adams (Present/No Report)

**Property Board:** Herb Meissel (Present/No Report)

Herb reported that he has been slowly working on the gutters. The church has custom gutters. Herb thinks he has the roof leaks fixed or at least getting closer to them being fixed by adding flashing and other necessary repairs. He is waiting for the insurance estimator to get back to him. There are still more trees to cut down and Herb needs a list of who to call to help him. Herb said we need to address the insulation in the gym as we are losing heat because of it.

**President:** Brian Hawkins (Present/No Report)

Brian started the conversation about the aging of the church building and what the future plans for the building and property are. Melissa noted that the mortgage is approximately \$20,000, thanks to some generous estate donations. Melissa added that the building can only be rented to non-profits. It was suggested that in the future, the church will need to have a committee to do the research on the possibilities of what to do with the building and property.

**Vice President:** Troy Palmer (Present/No Report)

**Unfinished Business:** No other unfinished business.

**New Business:** No other new business.

The next Council meeting will be on April 21st at 6:30pm. The congregation meeting will be May 16th at 12:30pm. Brian closed the meeting in prayer at 8:30pm.
